John David Adams is an acclaimed concert soloist, equally praised for portrayals in diverse opera and stage roles. He studied voice and opera at the



Hartt School of Music and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, establishing his professional music career on the west coast before returning to New England where he enjoys a busy schedule of performing engagements. His concert repertoire ranges from Baroque masterpieces to premiers of new works, in performances with orchestras and musical organizations from California to Maine including the San Francisco Symphony, Berkeley Symphony, Berkeley Lyric Opera Orchestra, Marin Chamber Orchestra, Arlington Philharmonic, North

Shore Philharmonic, New England Wind Symphony, Midcoast Symphony, Maine Pro Musica, Maine Music Society, Masterworks Chorale, Oratorio Chorale, San Francisco Bach Choir, St. Mary Schola, Blue Hill Bach, White Mountain Bach Festival, and Portland Early Music Festival. His opera and musical stage credits include roles with Opera Boston, San Francisco Lyric Opera, San Francisco Summer Opera, Granite State Opera, PORTopera, Apollo Opera, SOLO Opera, New England Light Opera, Maine State Music Theater, and Heartwood Regional Theater Company, among others.

Nina M. Tilander is an oratorio and recital soloist who has also performed with opera and theater companies in Massachusetts and Maine including



PORT, Surry Opera, Heartwood, and Lakewood. She has served as a guest artist with the Oratorio and Androscoggin Chorales as well as the Maine Gilbert & Sullivan "qwerty" productions.

While living in Seattle, she soloed several seasons at the Northwest Mahler Festival under the baton of Geoffrey Simon, two seasons with the "Mostly Nordic" series, and was invited to perform at the Swedish-American Heritage Society's 30th international celebration.

Other performances include the Sherman Clay Series and principal roles in a number of Gilbert & Sullivan productions. She has won vocal competitions on both coasts and coached with opera and Broadway artist Nancy Hermiston, vocal pedagogue Richard Miller, and British Wagnerian soprano Jane Eaglen. She currently studies with Charles Peterson of Seattle.



Founding Director of the St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, **Linda Blanchard** also directs the Sheepscot Valley Chorus and is Director of Choirs at St. Andrew's Church, Newcastle. She has directed the Bowdoin College Chamber Choir, University of Michigan Residential College Choirs and Orpheus Singers, worked in Maine and Michigan as a church organist and choir director, taught junior high and high school chorus in Maine, taught voice at Bowdoin College, and worked extensively as a musical theater director. Ms.

Blanchard earned her MA in Conducting from University of Michigan School of Music, Ann Arbor, and her BA in Music from Bowdoin College. She is recipient of the Susan Winchell Burnett Music Prize, the Abraham Goldberg Prize for Directing, and the St. Botolph Club Foundation Emerging Artist Grant. She studied orchestral conducting with Gustav Meier and Zae Munn, and choral conducting with Theodore Morrison, Jerry Blackstone, and Robert Greenlee.

Organist Sean Fleming performs regularly with the Bowdoin Chorus, Coastal Chorale, Down East Singers, Lincoln Academy Lincolnaires, Lincoln Festival Chorus, Maine Friends of Music, Maine Pro Musica, Midcoast Community Chorus, St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, Sheepscot Valley Chorus, and Tapestry Singers. He also regularly



accompanies many high school and junior high festivals. He has worked with Ann Arbor Camerata, Bowdoin Chamber Choir, Bowdoin Summer Music Festival Chorus, Colby College Chorale, Oratorio Chorale, Renaissance Voices, University of Michigan Gilbert and Sullivan Society, University of Southern Maine Chorale, University of Southern Maine Chamber Singers, and Vox Nova Chamber Choir. Sean has directed or accompanied over sixty-five musical theater productions nationwide. Most recently he was the music director for "Sunday in the Park with George" with Heartwood Regional Theater Company, and "Little Shop of Horrors" at The Waldo Theater. An organ recitalist who has performed thoughout the United States, Sean studied organ and piano with Ray Cornils, John Doney, Michael Lindsey, and Gerald McGee. For the past sixteen years he has served as organist at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Newcastle. He was the recipient of a 2009 St. Botolph Club Foundation grant award for achievements in music.

PROGRAM NOTES

by Linda Russell

Johannes Brahms (1833-1897), accomplished pianist and conductor as well as composer, had already achieved distinction as a musician when *Ein Deutsches Requiem* was premiered in 1868, but it was this work which gave him international recognition.

In 1856 the death of his close friend and mentor, Robert Schumann, had a powerful impact on Brahms, and he began the composition of a requiem. By reworking the slow movement of his D Minor Piano Concert, he created a choral setting on the text *Denn alles Fleisch es ist wie Gras* (Behold, all flesh is as the grass), the portion that is today the second movement of the *Requiem*. The work passed through various stages of development during the next few years, but his mother's death in 1865 provided the ultimate impetus to finish it. A six-movement *Requiem* was presented on Good Friday, 1868, in Bremen, but as William Mann observes, "Brahms evidently felt that it lacked a moment of melting radiance and a month later added the soprano solo (the fifth movement) as a supreme expression of his devotion to his mother." This final form of the *Requiem* quickly became a classic, being performed in Germany twenty times within the first year.

It is not so much the use of the German language which sets *Ein Deutsches Requiem* apart from the liturgical Roman Catholic requiem, as it is the expression of a Protestant attitude toward death and life after death. The Catholic *missa pro defunctis* (mass for the dead) commemorates the souls of the dead and offers prayers on their behalf. Brahms, on the other hand, has constructed his *Requiem* as a consolation for the living and an eternal affirmation of joy for the departed faithful. The underlying ideas of the Requiem may be summarized:

Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted. All flesh is as grass and all the glory of mankind like the flower of grass: man must one day die. But death is not an eternal annihilation; the redeemed of the Lord shall inherit everlasting joy and gladness, where sorrow and sighing no longer exist. And thus, blessed are the dead who die in the Lord henceforth. For death leads us into a better life; those who lead a God-fearing and upright life on earth shall see their dear ones again in heaven. They shall rest from their cares and labors, for their works follow them.

Brahms selected the texts from Martin Luther's German translation of the Old and New Testaments and the Apocrypha, choosing words of consolation, faith, humility, and hope, all centering on faith in the resurrection rather than fear of the day of judgment. Although there are seven movements, the work can be divided into two parts. The first three movements are devoted to earthly suffering and lamentation over the transitory nature of life; in the last four movements this mourning is gradually transformed into the triumph of the resurrection.

The *Requiem* was the first work in which Brahms combined mixed chorus, solo voices and full orchestra. The musical structure clarifies and illustrates the textual relationship. Brahms underscores the somber grief of the first movement by wholly excluding the bright timbres of violins, clarinets, and trumpets. In the second movement he contrasts an old chorale tune with a funeral-march rhythm in the orchestra, surprisingly stated in triple rather than duple meter. During the third movement the anguished words of the baritone solo and answering chorus are tossed about with ever-increasing intensity until the exultant concluding double fugue on the words "The souls of the righteous are in God's hand."

The serene fourth movement (How lovely are your dwellings, Lord) is the best-known section of the *Requiem*, and its comforting words are reinforced by a gently moving melody with rich harmonic support from horns and woodwinds. The choral affirmations of maternal consolation complement the soaring soprano solo in the fifth movement. In the sixth movement Brahms dwells briefly on the terror of the last judgment with the support of agitated orchestral figurations and full brass. But the choir shouts in triumph that "Death is swallowed up in victory" and concludes the battle against the fear of death with a glorious fugue in praise of God. Brahms completes the *Requiem* with a return to the key and theme of the opening movement. To affirm the state of blessed comfort for the dead he reinstates the brightly colored instruments that were excluded in the first movement.

The fact that the Brahms *Requiem* is second only to Handel's Messiah as the most often performed of all choral-orchestral works today testifies to its universal appeal.
