

A Case Study in Geothermal

In 2013, Tod Brown, a retired physics teacher, attended a "Geo-Night" seminar hosted by MCES. He and his wife, Merrilee, had been looking to cut energy expenses for their circa 1875 farmhouse, located in a rural setting complete with farm pond. According to Brown, the cost of fuel totaled \$4,668 for the year. In addition, they were using an average of 15,700 kilowatt-hours of electricity annually without air conditioning.



The Browns hired an energy auditor to provide suggestions on how to tighten up the home. Based on the auditor's information, MCES determined the appropriate size and design of a new geothermal system that would replace the Browns' existing furnace. MCES swapped out the furnace for a two-and-a-half-ton water-to-air unit. Outside, MCES utilized the Browns' farm pond by installing a 3-ton Pond/Lake Loop System. The vertical unit connected easily to the existing relatively new ductwork. The geoexchange system was up and running by late summer.

Inaccurate Audit.... "Our mistake was to accept the auditor's report as accurate

information," says Bill Morgner, MCES President. "As it turned out, it was not accurate, so even though the insulation contractor performed everything as specified, when winter came, we learned that our *little GEO that could* ...actually **couldn't**....not even with backup." In the spring of 2014, Bill Morgner made a company decision to remove the existing heat pump and replace it with a four-ton unit at his company's expense. In the summer of 2014, as promised, Mid-Coast Energy exchanged the units. According to Morgner, the only expense the Browns absorbed for the new larger geo unit, was the cost of changing the ductwork necessary to accommodate the horizontal heat pump—a cost they would have incurred anyway, had the system been properly sized initially. Aside from that, Morgner says "we picked up the tab."

February of 2015 was Maine's coldest on record. Despite the record-breaking heating season, the Brown's geothermal system performed flawlessly. In fact, the much larger unit proved to use less electric in a colder winter. Homeowner Tod Brown reported a 72% improvement in performance and a savings of \$3,446 over the baseline. Brown noted that "we can't thank Mid-Coast Energy Systems enough for the time and effort they spent on making our system work as it should, despite the fact that it wasn't their fault from the beginning." Linda Blanchard Sean Fleming David Wright Music Director **Linda Blanchard** earned her MA in Choral Conducting from University of Michigan School of Music, Ann Arbor, and her BA in Music from Bowdoin College. She is recipient of the Susan Winchell Burnett Music Prize, the Abraham Goldberg Prize for theatrical directing and the St. Botolph Emerging Artist Award. She studied orchestral conducting with Gustav Meier and Zae Munn, and choral conducting with Theodore Morrison, Jerry Blackstone, and Robert Greenlee. Ms. Blanchard is founding director of St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, directs the Sheepscot Valley Chorus and is Director of Choirs at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Newcastle. She has worked as a festival adjudicator and clinician, directed the Bowdoin College Chamber Choir, University of Michigan Residential College Choirs and Orpheus



Singers, worked in Maine and Michigan as a church organist and choir director, taught junior high and high school chorus in Maine, taught voice at Bowdoin College, and worked extensively as a musical theater director.

Sean Fleming performs regularly with the Bowdoin Chorus, Coastal Chorale, Down East Singers, Lincoln Academy Lincolnaires, Lincoln Festival Chorus, Maine Friends of Music, St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, Sheepscot Valley Chorus, and Tapestry Singers. Miserere Mei, Deus

The *Miserere* is written for two choirs, one of five and one of four voices, and is an example of Renaissance polyphony surviving to the present day. One of the choirs sings a simple version of the original *Miserere* chant; the other, spatially separated, sings an ornamented commentary on this.

The Tenebrae service where the *Miserere* would be sung normally began at dusk, hence the name (*tenebrae* is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness"). During the ritual, candles would be extinguished one by one, save for the last candle which remained alight and was then hidden. Allegri envisioned the setting of the Miserere to be the final act within the first lesson of the Tenebrae service.

At some point, it became forbidden to transcribe the music, and it was allowed to be performed only at those particular services at the Sistine Chapel, thus adding to the mystery surrounding the piece. Writing it down or performing it elsewhere was punishable by excommunication.

According to the popular story (backed up by family letters), the fourteen-year-old Mozart was visiting Rome, when he first heard the piece during the Wednesday service. Later that day, he wrote it down entirely from memory, returning to the Chapel that Friday to make minor corrections. Less than three months after hearing the song and transcribing it, Mozart had gained fame for the work and was summoned to Rome by Pope Clement XIV, only instead of excommunicating the boy, the Pope showered praises on him for his feat of musical genius and awarded him the Chivalric Order of the Golden Spur.

Ola Gjeilo

Ola Gjeilo (pronounced Yay-lo) was born in Norway in 1978, and moved to the United States in 2001 to begin his composition studies at the Juilliard School in New York City. He is currently composer-in-residence with Voces8. A full-time concert music composer based in New York City, Ola is also very interested in film, and his music often draws inspiration from

movies and cinematic music. His *Prelude* is a joyful work inspired by Scandinavian folk music. Of *Contrition*, the composer writes:

Contrition is one of my most personal, and in some ways private, pieces. I usually don't reflect my own life or private experiences and emotions in my music, I ideally want it to transcend my own personality and be more universal in nature. I guess I feel like my music should be bigger than me, bigger than my everyday concerns as a human being, concerns that may seem incredibly important in the moment, but in the grand scheme of things really doesn't amount to much, compared to the great mystery of life and the universe.

As the last line from George Herbert's poem Perseverance, which I use in this piece, goes; '*Thou art my rock, thou art my rest.*' Whether you call it God, Soul, Nature, or something else; it feels like without it, I am nothing.

Arvo Pärt

Arvo Pärt (1935) is an Estonian composer of classical and sacred music. Since the late 1970s, Pärt has worked in a minimalist style that employs his self-invented compositional technique, tintinnabuli. His music is in part inspired by Gregorian chant. Pärt is often identified with the school of minimalism and, more specifically, that of mystic minimalism or holy minimalism. He is considered a pioneer of the latter style, along with contemporaries Henryk Górecki and John Tavener. Although his fame initially rested on instrumental works such as *Tabula Rasa* and *Spiegel im Spiegel*, his *choral* works have also come to be widely appreciated.
